Area Extension Director Mary Pardee

Updates

- Completing mid-year reviews for staff. Any performance-related feedback from county leadership can be provided to me at any time.
- ➤ The Finance Department updated our office on carryover funds, some of which date back many years. We have been using some of the funds for professional development and curriculum/supply purchases.
- Approved funding from the City of Superior for youth development was reduced from \$5,000 to \$2,500 in the latest grant application. This was in Extension's 2023 budget as \$5,000 in revenue.

4-H Youth Development Katie Stenroos

- Co-planned and implemented a three-day 4-H Summer Camp that combined Douglas, Burnett and Washburn youth ages 8-11, with older youth serving as camp counselors.
 Douglas County sent 12 campers and 5 camp counselors.
 ▶ Provided two in-person training sessions for 4-H summer camp counselors to plan camp activities and teach them how to ensure a safe and engaging camp experience for young
- ▶ Provided educational activities for youth in collaboration with the City of Superior Parks and Recreation at six Summer Parks Program sites.
- ▶ Provided 4-H members and volunteers with *Head of the Lakes Fair* preparation and information. Supported the 4-H Leaders Association in youth building cleaning, project set up and the youth poster making session. Assisted with the 4-H horse show.
- Organized the Douglas/Washburn **4-H Outpost Camp** where middle and high school-aged youth participated

in environmental education while cooking over campfires and sleeping in treehouses. Of the 12 outpost campers, 10 were from Douglas County.

- Attending a 3-day training to become a **Youth Mental Health First Aid Facilitator**. This certification will enable me to teach parents, teachers and others how to help an adolescent who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crises through a 5-step action plan.
- Establishing a **new 4-H community club** in the City of Superior with assistance from engaged volunteers and parents.
- Planning and prepping for fall 4-H activities including **Afterschool 4-H**, the new enrollment season, and the 4-H Achievement Night.
- ▶ Preparing to recruit and train new youth representatives to the Douglas County Board of Supervisors.



FoodWise Julie Montgomery & Tarah Nichols

- Completed eight 2-hour *Teen Cuisine* cooking lessons with 25 students at Superior Middle School, where students learned cooking basics and made a recipe each session.
- Completed **Summer School** lessons at Northern Lights School.
- Met with garden donation site patrons to gain input into produce grown.
- Provided state **Strong Bodies** strength and balance virtual classes.
- Visiting Parks and Rec Summer Meal Sites to make connections with students and provide nutrition education activities (Hammond Park and Wade Bowl).
- Attended and co-led a Strong Bodies Leader Training in Rhinelander.
- Attended a regional meeting of FoodWIse coordinators and educators in Merrill.
- ▶ Planning for Fall classes in the classroom and virtual Strong Bodies series.
- Supporting *community gardens* volunteers and Growing Together Wisconsin grant recipients.

Updating quarterly Action Plan with Regional Program Manager and planning for FY24, which begins on October 1.

Human Development & Relationships Tracy Henegar

- Conscious Discipline a 10-session evidence-based blended parent/caregiver social/emotional workshop series, where participants complete a self-paced online session followed by an in-person discussion and application group offered in partnership with Family Forum Head Start.
- 16 participants registered; 11 participated.
- ▶ QPR Gatekeeper Suicide Prevention an evidence-based workshop designed to teach participants three simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide: Question, Persuade, and Refer. QPR Gatekeepers are trained to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and to respond in order to save a life.
- Facilitated 1 session for School District of Superior Coaches & Activity Advisors
- ➤ Triple P Positive Parenting Program ® an evidencebased parenting and family support system designed to prevent problems in the family before they arise and to create family environments that encourage children to realize their potential – a statewide collaboration.
- Co-facilitated 4 of 6 virtual sessions of Teen Triple P 37 registrations local & statewide
- ➤ **WeCOPE** a six-week virtual interactive program that helps adults cope with life stress. WeCOPE has been shown to reduce stress and depression, increase positive affect, and improve health behaviors.
- Wrapped up a 6-week virtual program, offered statewide. 20 people registered; 4 from Douglas County

Other Programming Highlights

- Continuing to partner with Douglas County Health Department to provide *Just In Time Parenting* to parents with children birth-6 years old. So far in 2023, we've sent out approximately 130 postcard invites to new parents.
- ▶ Prepping for fall outreach to Family Forum Head Start, Superior School District and the Superior Library to distribute <u>Parenting the Preschooler</u> and <u>Money Smart in Head Start</u> parenting newsletters.
- Coordinated a social media campaign for BIPOC Awareness Month.
- Continuing systems change work with the Douglas County Mental Health CCR Crisis Access Response & Engagement (CARE), as well as with the new initiative through the Miller Dwan Foundation: Reimagining Mental Health and Well-being in Douglas County.

Professional Development

- Participated in online training on the new *Rural MHFA* curriculum and the new *Tribal YMHFA* curriculum.
- Participating in a training series on *Systems Approaches* for Healthy Communities.
- Participated in refresher course on Compassion Resilience.
- Participated in *Introduction to Protective Factors* workshop to explore the viability of bringing this new training opportunity to our community.

- ▶ WeCOPE a six-week virtual interactive program that helps adults cope with life stress. WeCOPE has been shown to reduce stress and depression, increase positive affect, and improve health behaviors. Dates TBD
- ➤ Youth Wellness Summit This pilot offering is being designed to offer middle school students a leadership development conference experience focused on wellness. Nov. 15th, 2023 at UWS
