Goals #1 – Warrant Resolution Day: Dollen reported St. Louis County is having more warrant resolution days via Zoom, most recently on February 2, 2021. Logistics for this occurring in Douglas County discussed. Previously formed subcommittee to check out the next Warrant Resolution Day to be held in April, meet and review prior to next committee’s meeting.

Goal #2 – Community Service Program: Previously formed subcommittee to meet to determine status of program prior to this committee’s next meeting.

Conversation with the Courts – Dollen: Dollen attended recent Zoom Conversation with the Courts meeting held in Minnesota. Goal is to promote understanding and trust, and fight for equality in the courts. Next Conversation with the Courts scheduled for some time in March, topic undecided, with Dollen to provide exact date to committee chair.

Future Agenda Items:

Transgender Issues – Possible Future Presentation by Rachel Maes for May 13, 2021: Dollen to keep committee updated about whether or not this date will work.

Pre-Trial Supervision Discussion – Dollen: Committee reviewed topic previously, with identifying who would do the assessments a stumbling block. Utilizing student interns to research cash bail related occurrences suggested by Dollen, to aid in working on bail reform issues. Research may not be helpful for judges in determining how bail is set. Goal is for people to make their court appearances. Lenmark to attain information from Eau Claire County about tools currently being used, and bring forward findings to committee at next meeting.
