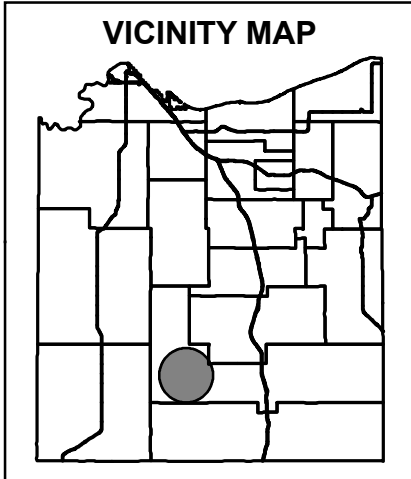

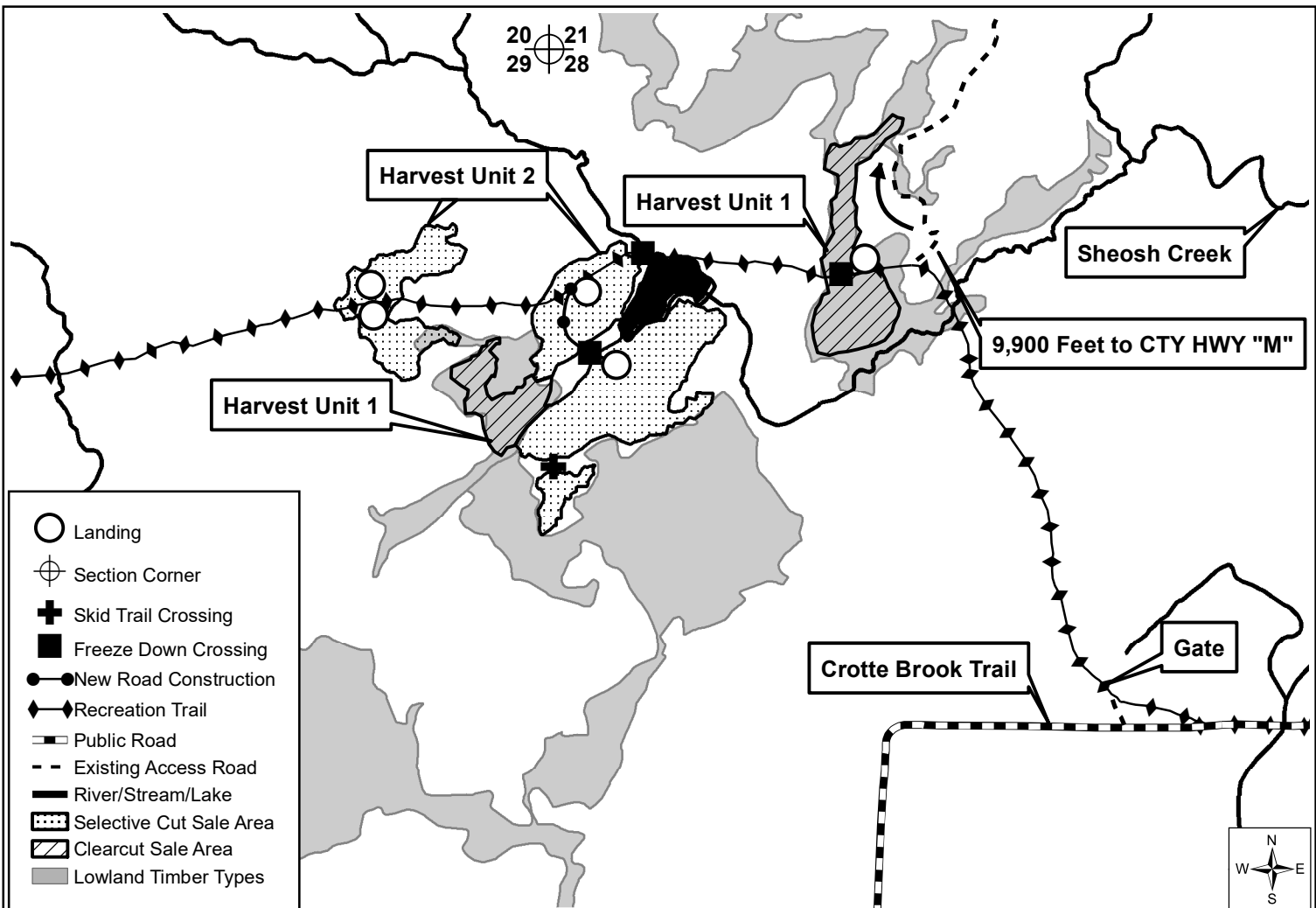

The Mixed HW volume contains approximately 31% Red Maple, 22% White Birch, 17% Sugar Maple, 13% Red Oak, 11% Aspen, 5% Basswood, and 1% Misc.



TRACT 29-22 (LONG LONG AGO) – SUPPLEMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Douglas County Timber Sale Contract:

A. PRESCRIPTION -

- Harvest unit 1 has a clear-cut with reserves harvest prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 15ft2.
- Harvest unit 2 has a seed tree harvest prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 25ft2.

B. SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS -

- All harvesting operations shall be limited to frozen ground conditions only.

C. TREES DESIGNATED FOR CUTTING -

- In harvest unit 1, fell, skid, and haul all red maple, basswood, white birch, and greater than 6-inch DBH black ash stems that meet the product and utilization standards as per product bid.
- In harvest unit 2, fell all non-marked red maple, aspen, basswood, sugar maple, aspen, white birch, black ash and miscellaneous species stems; and all greater than 8-inch DBH non-marked red oak stems. Skid and haul all felled stems that meet the product and utilization standards as per product bid.

D. TREES DESIGNATED FOR LEAVING -

- In harvest unit 1, reserve and leave undamaged all white pine, white spruce, yellow birch, cedar, and black ash stems less than 6-inch DBH.
- In harvest unit 2, reserve and leave undamaged all white pine, white spruce, tamarack, white birch, and green marked stems; and all less than 8-inch DBH red oak.

E. HARVEST AND OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS -

- In harvest unit 2, "Slashing Maintenance" is required, excluding desirable advanced sub-merchantable red oak and white birch regeneration.
- Five landing locations shall be identified during the pre-operations meeting.
- One skid trail crossing shall be constructed as designated. The sale administrator will layout and flag in the crossing at the time of the pre-operations meeting. All equipment operation and skidding in this portion of the sale area shall be limited to this crossing.

F. ACCESS AND ROADS -

- The total length of the access road system is approximately 15,250 feet. Approximately 8,900 feet of existing "Class 2" access road, 5,500 feet of existing "Class 3" access road, and 850 feet of new "Class 3" access road.
- Portions of the existing access road may require minimal "Class 2" and "Class 3" reconstruction before use.
- Three "Freeze Down Crossings" and the new road construction shall be identified during the pre-operations meeting.
- The access road is gated.
- The access road utilizes a significant portion of a winter snowmobile trail.
- All access shall be from the north off County Road M. No access from the south off Crotte Brook Trail shall be permitted.
