

### Citizen Lake Monitoring Network (CLMN)

The Citizen Lake Monitoring Network is a partnership between citizens and the Department of Natural Resources. Goals of the CLMN are to collect high quality data, educate and empower volunteers, and share information on lakes.

The program provides training and equipment to volunteers to collect data on a lake(s) of their choice. Volunteers can choose to monitor a lake's:

- 1) Water clarity
- 2) Chemistry, temperature, and dissolved oxygen
- 3) Native plant population
- 4) Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS)
